# **M.O.ZONE - Seen Around the Strand**

On 12/22/13, in the afternoon, while on Mud Tram, Skip Fisher observed 2-Juvenile White Ibis, and 10 American Robins. On 12/25/12, Amy Chinea, volunteer, observed next to and over Janes Scenic Drive (JSD), 2 Great Egrets, and more than 400 Tree Swallows circling overhead, then fly off to the South.

On 1/2/13, Tom Trotta observed an Adult **Big Cypress Fox Squirrel** off of US-41 near the Port of the Islands. On 1/4/13, Mike Owen, Biologist, observed south of US-41 during the Ten Thousand Island Bird Count, a **Red-tailed Hawk**, 3 **Tri-colored Herons**, 2 **Roseate Spoonbills**, 2 **Greater Yellow-Legs**, and a **Sora** among other birds. On 1/6/13, in the early afternoon, on the beginning of the JSD, Holly and Norman Roy saw a **Praying Mantis**, a **Chicken turtle**, **Great Egrets**, **White Ibis**, and near the end of the drive, a **Bobcat** walking across JSD and about 50 **American Robins** and a **Red-shouldered Hawk**.

On 1/7/13, Stephen Bass, Ranger, observed 3 **Black Bears** off of Jones Grade. On 1/12/13, while on a volunteer work day, FOF members John Kaiser, Bob Becker, Dave Pickering, and Howard Lubel saw a sub-adult **Black Bear** on the west end of Mud Tram at approximately 12:30 PM. On 1/13/13, between 9-11AM, off of Union Road in Dan House Prairie, Bente Torvund, Administrative Assistant, observed an adult **Northern Harrier**, a **Red-belly Slider**, 8 **Savannah Sparrows**, 10 **Eastern Meadowlarks**, and 1 adult **Green Anole** on a Cabbage Palm frond.

On 1/20/13, Edite Hughes, volunteer, observed and heard 2 **Red-shouldered Hawks** and a **Barred Owl** calling while hiking off Union Road. On 1/21/13, Skip Fisher reported seeing a **Common Snapping Turtle** along JSD and a male **Kestrel** fly to the west over the drive.

## **BOARDWALK REPORT**

We have at least one **eaglet** this year! Though one has been sighted many times, only one at any one time, so the total number is still a mystery. Both adult **Florida Bald Eagles** have been actively attending the nest, flying in and out, exchanging places, bringing food to the nest, and sitting on the Watching Tree. So much activity is exciting.

So much activity is everywhere – both the wildlife and the visitors! At any given moment the parking lot is full of cars; obviously, a most popular tourist stop at this end of the state!

The water is dropping, **Cardinal Bromeliads** can be found in bloom and the **Bald Cypress** trees are getting their new leaves making a dramatic change to the landscape. The change is wonderful to watch.

Bird sightings reported this month include Red-Shouldered Hawks, White Ibis, Great Egrets, Osprey, Red-Bellied, Downing and Pileated Woodpeckers, Carolina Wrens, Great Crested Flycatchers, American Crow, Blue Jay, Catbird, Blue Grey Gnatcatcher and White-Eyed Vireo.

Our "resident" Great Blue Heron which seems to "own"

the parking area has been strutting around and regularly sitting on cars – as though he enjoys his reflection in the car windshields; the other day he was seen stabbing at a windshield wiper – wonder what he was thinking ...



Other sightings include **Turtles**, **Alligators** both juvenile and adult, **Deer**, **Cottonmouth** and **Black Racer Snakes** and the adult **Florida Black Bear** with her two cubs.

#### Young Birders at the Boardwalk by Karen Relish

On January 12, Kathy Hatch, Cyril Marks and I joined some Young Birders and their family members from the Collier County Audubon on the Big Cypress Bend Boardwalk. Their compiled list of what they saw included a Great Egret, Great Blue Heron, Snowy Egret, Green Heron, Turkey vulture, Tree swallows, Palm warblers, Blue Gray Gnat Catchers, Yellowbellied Sapsucker, American Robins, Bald Eagles and Osprey. They also heard Catbirds, White-eyed Vireo, Barred Owl, Downy and Red-bellied Woodpeckers.

They are working on a Blue Bird project and with the assistance of Fakahatchee volunteers and support of the Friends of Fakahatchee. Blue Bird Box kits were provided to the appreciative Young Collier Audubon members.
