M.O.ZONE - Seen Around the Strand

On 10/1/09, around noon, Ann and Michael Karr, visitors, reported seeing an adult **Florida Panther** cross JSD just before K2. On 10/1/09, around 9:30AM, Mike Owen, Biologist, observed 1 **Red-tailed Hawk** perched on a snag about 90 yards west of Janes and about a half mile north of Gate 1. On 10/1/09, about 10:30AM, Mike Owen, Dave Westervelt, Environmental (Apiary) Scientist, and Jason Graham, University of Florida PhD student, observed one female **Redstart** on a Laural oak north of Gate 7. On 10/1/09, about 5:30PM, Dave Westervelt and Jason Graham observed a large **bobcat** cross JSD at 2.5 miles past the office. On 10/1/09, in the late evening, one **crayfish snake** about 16 inches was seen in the first two miles of JSD by Karen Relish, OPS Park Ranger, and Dave Westervelt. They also heard 6 King rails calling to each other from the prairies in the beginning of JSD.

On 10/6/09, in the morning, Alicia Mumford, Park Ranger, and Laura Skinner, AmeriCorps member, observed a **Florida BlackBear** approximately 150 pounds within the first two miles of JSD. On 10/6/09, Renee Rau, Park Manager, and Steve Houseknecht, Park Services Specialist, observed a large adult **Bald Eagle** south of Jones Grade perched on a Pine Snag. On 10/7/09, around 10:15AM, one **black and white warbler** was observed in a slough by Mike Owen. On 10/9/09, Mike Owen, saw a female **Cooper's Hawk** flying over the drive just past Gate 3.

On 10/19/09, in the early evening, Don Leonard, volunteer, saw a **Florida Black Bear** weighing about 200 pounds near Gate 16. On 10/22/09, in the midafternoon, while reading the wells, Mike Owen saw 3 **American Bitterns** in Four Stakes Prairie. On 10/22/09, in the area of the Park office, during the morning, Misty Miller, Administrative Assistant, noted a **belted kingfisher** perched in a tree near the pond next to the Fire tower, a **tri-colored heron** walking along the edge of the same pond, and a **black vulture** perched in a Bald Cypress just outside the entrance to the office.

On 10/23/09, Mike Owen and Karen Relish observed a **Ruby-throated hummingbird** female (white throat) flying north to south across JSD. He also noted near the end of the drive, in the mid afternoon, a **Florida Panther** around 50-70 pounds walk to the North crossing the North ditch behind a clump of Fakahatchee grass and into the strand. On 10/28/09, in the morning, Robert Czarnecki, volunteer, observed both a male and female **kestrel** flying near the western boundary of Fakahatchee.

We are seeing **Chicken turtles** digging holes to lay their eggs. Ron Kotliar is monitoring chicken turtle activity weekly along JSD while reading the JSD staff gauges. Both Steve Houseknecht and Don Leonard saw one on 10/12/09 between Gate 2 and 3 and Steve Houseknecht and Mike Owen saw one near the park headquarters.

Correction On 6/2/09, Alicia Mumford, Park Ranger, not Steve Houseknecht, Park Services Specialist, saw the 10-inch-long Diamondback rattlesnake on Janes Scenic Drive (JSD) not along Prairie Canal.

President's Message

Your Board met on November 8th and passed motions on the following issues.

PayPal will be instituted to make it easier for our Members and Visitors to register and pay for activities, dues, and events. This program has been successfully used by other park volunteer groups

Big Cypress National Preserve has asked the Friends to contribute funding toward the displays in their new Visitor's Center on US-41 just east of SR-29. Since the Fakahatchee is a major part of the Big Cypress eco-system the Board voted to help pay for a permanent display. Look for it when the Center opens in February 2010.

Jay Staton has filmed a new DVD to aid in the promotion of the Friends Scholarship. It is designed to be shown in Collier County High Schools to develop student interest in the wonders of the Fakahatchee. You will be able to view the show at the Welcome Back dinner December 13th.

Allen Caldwell, Chair of the Finance committee, is preparing our "Partnership in Parks" Grant request. The Florida Parks System has a program that if a Friends CSO will contribute \$60,000 for Park Improvements the State will give a \$40,000.00 match. The FOF has the amount set aside in a CD for our portion. We plan to use this grant to implement the planning and permitting for the Boardwalk renovation and expansion plus the new Visitor's center.

The Park can use their record of volunteer hours to show how much support it has. And, if FOF ever apply for a grant, each hour is worth about \$17.00 in "matching funds" (ie, if we have to contribute 50/50 to the grant money, those hours count as money from FOF).

So, please send in your report each month. The deadline for the Fakahatchee is the 5th day after the end of the month.

It's easy to keep track; I have a little notebook on my desk in which I record what I've done each day for the Friends or the park and then summarize at the end of the month to send to Renee and Misty. Or, you could have a clipboard in your car.

However you keep track of your hours, don't forget to report them! You'll be helping the Fak in two ways – the actual work and the credit that the park gets from having such willing and active volunteers.

BOARDWALK REPORT

The Boardwalk Committee (Nelson Tilden, Dennis Giardina, Bud Scott, Dick Hughes and Kathy Hatch) will meet later in November. They will consider regular Boardwalk work days, signage for major trees and plants, the restrooms, and the iron ranger. A good complaint is that our donation box is not large enough for all the contributions we receive from visitors to the Boardwalk during the winter months.

Editor's Note: The Boardwalk is very pleasant these days. More cars are being seen in the parking lot and the iron ranger is yielding higher bank deposits.

BOARDWALK HISTORY

Not everyone notices the sign at the Boardwalk which announces that Big Cypress Bend was declared a National Natural Landmark in 1966 by the National Park Service. It is described as "probably the best sizeable example of a tropical swamp remaining in the Southeast. It contains the largest royal palm stand in the country."

The property, including Weaver's Camp across the Trail, was bought by Naples conservationist Lester Norris when it was threatened with logging in the late 1950s. He built the Boardwalk so people could enjoy the rare plants and trees.

In 1976, the State bought the parcel, excluding Weaver's Camp, and Mr. Norris donated \$10,000 for maintenance. We should all be grateful for his insight into what was worth saving and his generosity.

The illustrated talk will be given by Franklin Adams and Marya Repko. Franklin was involved with Mel Finn in the effort to save the Fakahatchee from development. Marya Repko is a local historian who has just completed a book about the Fakahatchee islands, the logging in the strand, and Gulf American's Golden Gate Estates ("the blocks") and Remuda Ranch (now Port of the Islands).
