News from the Strand

Fakahatchee Strand Bio Blitz 2023/2024

Come out to the beautiful Fakahatchee Strand Preserve State Park and help gather vital data on wildlife trends. This year the Bio Blitz will be held from November through May of 2024. This is a great opportunity to meet like-minded individuals and learn more about the abundant wildlife that calls Fakahatchee Strand home. The data you collect is important to ongoing research and conservation efforts.

The dates will be:

- November 15th
- · December 13th
- · January 10th
- · February 7th
- · March 13th
- April 10th
- May 8th

We will meet at the Park office (past the gate beside the visitor center) by 7:45am. Data collection starts at 8:30am. Sites are indicated by distance in miles north of Gate 1 (water treatment facility). The volunteer at each site will document the following for observed animals:

- · Date
- Time
- · Animal observed
- · Direction of animal's travel
- Observer comments (Life stage, size, health, Male/Female etc.)

Donation Strategies by Chris Fair

Wealth requires discipline

Aretha Franklin's (Michigan) will – found in a spiral notebook stuffed in a couch – would have never seen the light of day let alone a courtroom in Florida. It is state law that governs our property rights with strict rules about what is a Will and what is not. Witness attestation is a must in Florida. The obvious lesson, a DIY last Will and Testament is recipe for disaster.

And so, too with the Internal Revenue Code when it comes to getting the tax benefit from making a gift from our IRA to Friends. Here are the rules:

- You must be over 70 1/2.
- Only IRAs are eligible, not 401(k)s or the like.
- · The funds must be fully taxable income to qualify.
- The funds must go directly to the charity. No stopping along the way in your checking account.
- The maximum you can contribute is \$100,000 per year.
- The charity must provide a written confirmation of the gift confirming the source is your IRA.

"Matching Gift" programs

Several of our members have taken advantage of their employer's matching program (General Electric, Exxon Mobil) for donations to not-for-profit organizations by sending us the "matching" form. We do the rest – it's that easy!

With this in mind, you can be assured of a good result. As discussed here, the transaction is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD. And with less than 10% of taxpayers itemizing (I suspect a much higher percentage for those over 70 ½), it makes sense to discuss with your tax advisor.

And please, see an estate planning attorney to avoid having a judge decide who gets what.
